Payments

Please may we remind you that all payments for Toast, School Dinners, Breakfast Club or Stay and Play must be paid on Monday mornings for that week. Please pay using the Eduspot, school pay system. If debts are not paid we will have to refuse access to these until payments are made. If you are experiencing difficulties please speak to Mrs Westwell or Mrs Ingham in the office. Please ensure letter responses are returned as soon as possible.

Absence

If your child is absent please leave a message on the dedicated absence line 01254 234089. Emails and Seesaw messages are sometimes getting missed and Mrs Ingham in the office needs to be able to account for every child.

Adverse Weather Conditions

We do not anticipate having to close the school during the winter months. However, in the event of heavy snowfall any closures will be put on the text messaging service, School Website, BBC Radio Lancashire.

The decision to close school is never taken lightly, but we do have to consider the safety of pupils and staff (many of whom travel long distances to work).

In the event of cold weather please can you ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for outdoor play, coats, hats, gloves, scarves, wellies etc..(all named)



Attendance & Punctuality

Please make every effort to get your child to school each day and on time – it makes so much difference to their learning and future achievements.

Head Lice Alert!

We have had a number of cases of headlice in school. We do send text alerts out and speak to individual parents if we see them on a child. The best way to get rid of them is to smother your child's hair in conditioner every week (even if they don't appear to have them) and then comb through their hair with a nitty gritty comb (from the chemist). Unfortunately it is very easy to miss an egg and if this happens your child will be infected again within a very short space of time. Your child does. not need to stay off school when treatment is taking place
